

Thinking Abilities and General Knowledge Activity for 48 to 54 Months

Favorite Ice Cream Graph

Graphing is a visual way for children to experience the concepts of "more" or "less."

Materials:

- Poster board or paper, 18 by 16 inches laminated or covered with clear contact paper
- Brown construction paper cut into cone shapes to form the base of each column
- Name tags made from construction paper circles in colors to represent the ice cream flavors
- Tape to attach name tags to the chart

What to do:

- 1. Ask the children individually to tell you their favorite flavor of ice cream so you know which flavors to include on the graph. (Do this the day before the activity.)
- 2. Paste the paper-cone shapes at the bottom of the poster board and write a flavor under each cone.
- 3. Invite the children, one by one, to find their name tag and tape their "ice cream" above the cone.
- 4. Have the children count to quantify how many children chose each flavor of ice cream.
- 5. Have the children compare column heights to determine whether there are more, fewer, or the same number of choices of flavor.
